

Inhaler technique Nexthaler





Patient information

Nexthaler

1	Hold the NEXThaler in the upright position and open the mouthpiece cover fully
2	Breathe out as far as is comfortable for you and away from the NEXThaler
3	Seal your lips around the mouthpiece. Do not cover the air vents
4	Breathe in as strongly and deeply as you can
5	Remove the NEXThaler from your mouth and hold your breath for up to 10 seconds. Breathe out slowly Your inhaler contains a steroid ingredient and you should rinse your mouth with water or brush your teeth after using it; this is to prevent infections such as oral thrush
6	Close the mouthpiece
7	For a second dose, wait for 30 seconds and repeat steps 1 - 6

Remember 3 simple steps: 1. OPEN 2. INHALE 3. CLOSE

Looking after your NEXThaler

You may clean your inhaler using a dry cloth or tissue after use Do not clean your inhaler with water or other liquids; keep it dry
