Table of contents alerts

Did you know? KnowledgeShare lets you provide regular table of contents alerts (TOCs) to members. Right now, only 4% of members receive TOCs, but there is wide variation across the country, with one team providing them to 59% of their members!

How do I set up TOCs for my members?

TOCs are set up from the Journal Alert section of a member's KnowledgeShare record. Journals can be selected from the drop-down list in the 'Subscribe to Journal' field. Clicking 'Add to List' adds a journal to the list of TOCs members receive from their assigned librarian. Some titles may not be available if they are not currently indexed in PubMed, though we are looking at expanding the options.

When will TOCs be sent? Most TOCs for a member will be sent in a single email on the first weekend following the month of publication. An article published in February will be sent out on the first weekend in March. There may be exceptions, as we are reliant on the date that articles are added to PubMed.

How do I promote TOCs to my members?

We recommend adding an option to your KnowledgeShare sign-up form or library membership form, e.g.

Category Q&A



How should I categorise a member working in the pain management service?



The parent category Pain is available, but for long-term management you may want to exclude Acute Pain and select Chronic Pain. Arthralgia, Neuralgia and Complex Regional Pain Syndromes are also available.

Consider including conditions that cause painful symptoms such as Fibromyalgia, Rheumatoid Arthritis etc.

Combine these with relevant Settings, and the Staff Group categories that match your member's role (for example, Physiotherapist, Occupational Therapist, Anaesthetist, Nurse Specialist, Pharmacist, or Psychologist.)
